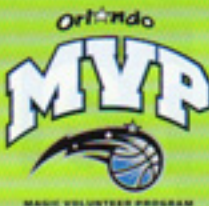

With the culmination of the 2007-08 season, the Orlando Magic are still hard at work in the community and making a difference in the lives they touch. The Magic, along with presenting sponsor KIA and Cotter Ryan Construction, unveiled their third reading and learning center in June. The New Image Youth Center, on Parramore Avenue, is home to 25 kids ages 5-15 who seek educational assistance, summer tutoring and after-school programs. Shantae Stubbs, a 26-year-old student and director of the center, has dedicated her time, energy and finances to create a fun, inviting and safe place for neighborhood children to live, learn and grow. With less than a month of planning, the Magic staff, KIA and Cotter Ryan Construction spent two weeks renovating the dilapidated facility with new plumbing, walls, fixtures and paint. Founded in 2004, the center, piece by piece, was redesigned and resurrected as a state-of-the-art learning facility that will offer resources and the necessary tools for the children to reach their goals and succeed academically. With \$10,000, the Magic and KIA purchased new computers, software, supplies, educational games and books for the children.



This project would not have been possible without the countless hours and tireless effort from our volunteers. The Orlando Magic Volunteer Program (MVP) encourages Magic players, coaches and staff to get involved in the community and give back to those less fortunate. Through this program and projects like the New Image Youth Center renovations, the Orlando Magic organization accumulated 5,878 volunteer hours in one year since last July.
